- Intensive outpatient services
  - Individual counseling
    - Group therapy
- Specialized groups for men & women

Anger management

- Power and Control (formerly known as Batterers Intervention)
- DWI group (approved by NYS OASAS)
- Medical/Psychiatric screening services
  - Medication Assisted Therapy
- Treatment and medication management for those with co-occurring disorders
  - Peer services
  - Family services
- Referrals for those in need of detoxification, medical, social services, and inpatient treatment

### How is progress monitored?

Your treatment with us is strictly voluntary. Progress in treatment is a collaborative process between you and your counselor, and it is measured by your accomplishments while in treatment.

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
