Distracted Driving

Long Island teens need EAC's driving programs.

Car crashes are a leading cause of death for 16–17-year-olds in New York State. Lives could be saved if new, teen drivers and their parents participated in EAC Network's driver education programs:

Teen Driving Equation enforces positive driving skills, develops safe habits early on, and emphasizes the importance of responsibility, parental liability, and the collaboration of parents, teens, and the community in the prevention of motor vehicle crashes.

Second Chances in Occupant Protection for Everyone (SCOPE) educates defendants on

distracted and aggressive driving, occupant protection, the danger of unlicensed motorists and DWI/DWAI.

- The New York Department of Motor Vehicles' Parent/Teen Contract helps parents and new teen drivers set and instill safe driving rules, together.
- The CDC's *Eight Danger Zones* informs on the leading causes of teen crashes.
- MotoSafety is a teen driving GPS that allows parents tomonitor safe driving behavior.
- NY State's Graduated Driver License (GDL) delays licensure while teens gain experience and decreases teen crashes by 80%.
